Season of Lent

Lent officially began with Ash Wednesday on February 17th, with the First Sunday of Lent being on February 21st. This also brings about quite a few changes not only in our liturgy but also in the physical appearance of our worship space. Stations of the Cross adorn our walls and our Altar space undergoes a transformation.

You will notice no brass candle holders but instead, wooden candle holders. The collection plate is either a woven basket or wood not the brass that we use during the rest of the season. Our processional cross made of wood and brass is just plain wood. The color for Lent is Purple. There are also no Altar Flowers during Lent.

This is all done intentionally to reflect a more solemn, prayerful and reflective mood as we wait in anticipation of the glory of Easter.

The same is true with our Liturgy which undergoes a dramatic shift in tone during Lent. At worship service there is no singing or saying the word "Alleluia".

Stations of the Cross



Lent began with Ash Wednesday, this year on February 17th. You will notice the Stations of the Cross posted on the walls of the nave of the church in preparation for our Lenten observance, and they will remain there until Easter Sunday. Take a few

moments before our worship service begins on

Sunday morning and walk around and reflect on the scenes that are depicted.

From the initial days of the fledgling Christian Church, Jesus' followers told the story of his passion, crucifixion at Calvary, and His Resurrection. followers When came Jerusalem, they were anxious to see the sites where the important events had occurred. Over time, following in Jesus' footsteps during His last day, following the Way of the Cross, became a regular part of the visit of most pilgrims. As the Church spread, it became more difficult for members to make their way to these holy sites. As a result, in the 1500's, villages all over Europe started creating shrines or plaques of these sites commemorate the events. Initially the number varied widely but was eventually set at the current fourteen that we now use

The liturgy of the Stations of the Cross is a contemplative reflection upon the agony experienced by Our Lord as He made His way from the trial through His crucifixion and ends with His body being laid in the tomb. We, too, move from event to event during these last hours of Jesus' life.

We will observe the Stations of the Cross as a community on Good Friday, April 2nd at 3:00 p.m.
